

FCCF COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES March 13, 2024

The meeting was called to order by Council Chair, Linda Schweyer, at 4:05 pm followed by the opening prayer.

The minutes from the February 14, 2024 meeting were reviewed. With no corrections noted, the minutes were approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report: Scott Harrison

The wallpaper is showing its age and the walls behind the paper are not in good shape. Committee members will research this. Many projects are being worked on; check in with any Property Committee member if you are interested in things that have been completed, or things that are ongoing projects.
