

Denis reported that it has been an excellent 2 1/2 years for the Church's investments and the investment strategy will remain the same for 2014. <u>Memorials:</u> Judy Welch: During the month of December, \$500.00 was given to the Memorial Fund in memory of Luanne Buzzell and Mary Helen Growt.
