





A RARE OPPORTUNITY

Join us, following Worship and Lunch on Sunday, March 17 in the Parlor to hear how we can Keep Each Other Safe. The Outreach Committee has invited Linda Solem, Prevention Specialist for Up North Prevention, a Catholic Human Services Initiative, to learn about human trafiking as it pertains to this little slice of God's Benzie. She is planning on a 20 minute presentation on this modern form of slavery, exploitation and forced labor that lies below the radar that can affect anyone of us.





THE FORTRESS ANTONIA is the local seat of Roman government. Here we will tour the military barracks of the occupation police force (the army which has brought Roman peace, law, and culture to the whole world!), visit the cell block where notorious criminals are incarcerated, and also observe THE PAVEMENT, the civil court where Roman justice is administered. If possible, this visit will be scheduled at a time when a civil trial is in progress.

Linda Solem has an associate in applied sciences degree (AAS) in paralegal studies from Northwestern Michigan University and a Bachelor of Science in Organizational Management from Spring Arbor University. She has completed her certification for the MCBAP Development Plan for Certified Prevention Specialist. She works for Up North Prevention, advancing substance misuse prevention efforts in northern Lower Michigan. She is dedicated as a full-time staff person to this proposal, working to create awareness and collaboration within communities to meet the needs of the marginalized through drug misuse prevention and human trafficking awareness. She actively educates communities with an evidence-based curriculum and makes them safe from substance misuse. By collaborating with key community leaders, educators, and parents in preventing drug and alcohol misuse among at-risk youth, she is working to create safety and health for our children in assisting in reducing the at-risk population and combating human trafficking. Linda is on the board of the Coalition to Combat Human Trafficking, and she participates in the Community Advisory Group of the Grand Traverse County Wellness Center. She is a Grand Traverse County Drug-Free Coalition member and the Quick Response Team with the Traverse City Police Department.
