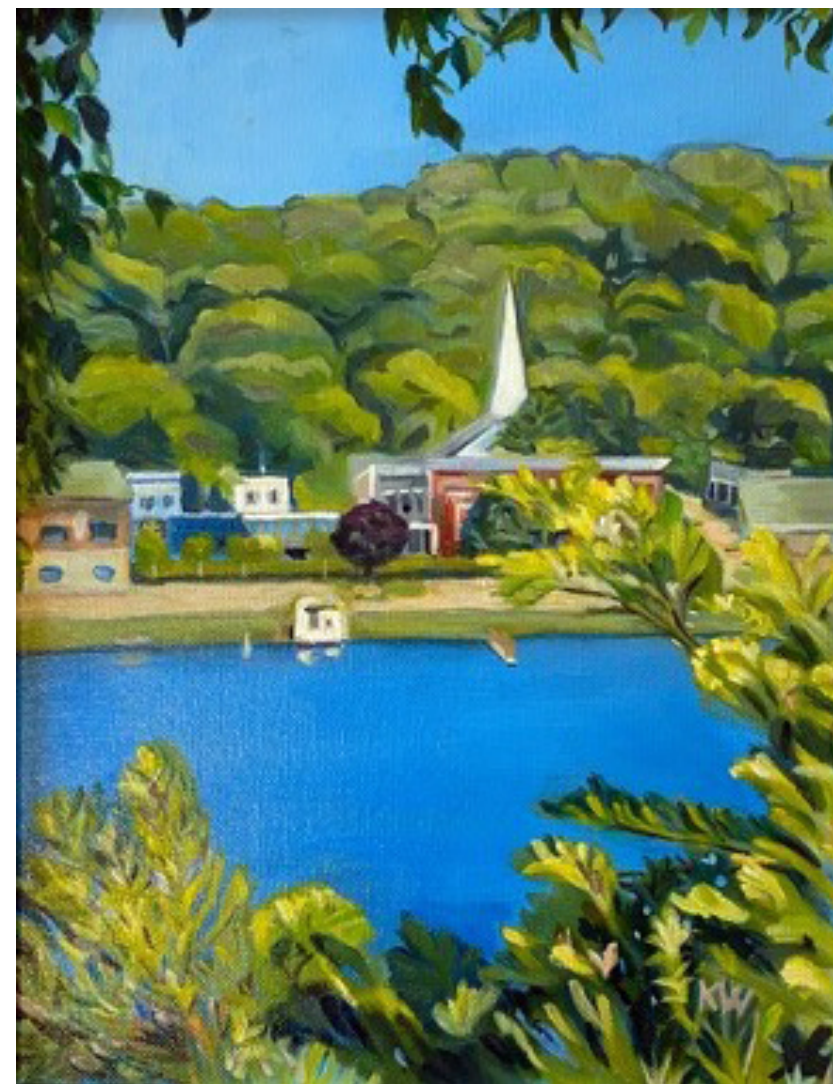

BACN is getting ready to break ground on their new facility!

Soon, there will be a new door into the facility, the building will be wrapped in construction fencing, and parking will be affected. We will still be open for services. Watch for updates on Facebook and on our website, www.benziebacn.org. Watch for the “BACN Building Guy’s” photo...when you see him, we have an update that might affect visits to BACN. For now, we’ll still be accepting clothing donations on Saturdays from 9 a.m. till noon. Space (both in the parking lot and building) will be very limited during construction. Once the new building is operational, we will go back to taking donations throughout the week. For now, we’re able to accept: Clean clothing and accessories (including shoes), small housewares such as dishes, pots and pans, blankets, sheets and towels.
